

**RESOLUTION NO. 2005- 37**

**A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM, KNOWN AS NIMS, AS THE INCIDENT SYSTEM TO BE USED FOR PLANNING, RESPONDING, RECOVERY, AND MITIGATING FROM BOTH NATURAL AND MANMADE DISASTERS WITHIN JEFFERSON COUNTY**

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for federal, state, local, and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size, or complexity; and

WHEREAS, the collective input and guidance from all federal, state, local, and tribal homeland security partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the development, effective implementation and utilization of a comprehensive NIMS; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that all federal, state, local, and tribal emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management; and

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management, it is critical that federal, state, local, and tribal organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualification standards, uniform standards for planning, training, and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters; and


WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities, and resources will improve Jefferson County's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local and state agency readiness, maintain first responder safety, and streamline incident management processes; and

WHEREAS, the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various incident management activities throughout the state in accordance with K.S.A. 48-928 (o), including current emergency management training programs; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 19, 2005, the Governor of the State of Kansas, Kathleen Sebelius, signed Executive Order No. 05-03 designating NIMS as the incident management system to be used in Kansas;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Jefferson, Kansas, meeting in regular session this 12<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2005, under the laws of the State of Kansas, does hereby establish the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the County standard for incident management.


